If received on/before January 31st:

5-6 and 7-8 Age Groups: \$45.......9-10 age group and older: \$65

If received on/after March 1st:

5-6 and 7-8 Age Groups: \$65......9-10 age group and older: \$85

15-19 Baseball will be \$165 per player. Tryout forms will be available at the walk-in registrations and on the web page.

MULTI-CHILD DISCOUNT -- When registering multiple children from the same household, you may subtract \$5 from the second child's fee, and \$10 from the third. The fourth child or more plays for no additional fee.

SIGN-UPS FOR TRAVEL TRYOUTS will be available at the two walk-in registration sessions in January. All players who sign up for travel tryouts must register and pay for in-house baseball before they can participate in the February tryouts. Players can also sign up for travel tryouts by sending an e-mail to travelbaseball@foresthillrec. com. Please include your name, age, date of birth and phone number. A separate fee will be required for players who make a Travel team.

We ask all potential travel players to sign up in advance so we are better able to anticipate the turnout at the tryouts. Tryouts for age groups that show insufficient interest by January 26th will be cancelled and there will not be a travel team in that age group.

TRYOUT REGISTRATION FORMS FOR 15-19 BASEBALL

and fees will be accepted by mail or at the walk-in registration sessions listed above. The fee is \$165.00, which covers the costs of umpires, uniforms and equipment. See the "15-19 BASEBALL TRYOUT-REGISTRATION FORM" included in this Newsletter. Tryouts are in mid-March and players must pay the fee at the time of registration. Those not making a 15-19 team will be refunded in full.

2008 IN-HOUSE BASEBALL/SOFTBALL NEWS:

Monthly baseball/softball meetings started back in November, and are held on the second Monday of every month from November through April. The best way to get involved with Forest Hill baseball and softball is to come to the meetings. We are constantly looking for new ways to make our programs fun for the players, coaches and their parents, and we have some special surprises in store for this year. 5-6 BASEBALL/SOFTBALL: The very successful 5-6 clinic will meet and practice on Fields 8 and 9 at Forest Lakes Elementary School on Saturdays at 10:00 A.M. starting April 12th. The 5-6 program runs through June 21st. Although youth baseball nationwide has moved the age cut-off date to April 30th, we will still accept boys and girls in the 5-6 program who turn 5 between April 30th and July 31, 2008 with the understanding that the youngsters who fall into this category must also play in the 5-6 program in 2009 as well. Children who turn 5 after July 31, 2008 must wait until 2009 to participate in the 5-6 Clinic at Forest Hill.

7-8 BASEBALL: In an effort to constantly improve our programs, the 7-8 program will be fine-tuned and once again will break the teams into two groups - a 7 year old group and an 8 year old group. Emphasis will be on the fundamentals of baseball, keeping the players moving and learning, and practicing their skills in preparation for the higher age groups through drills, practice and games.

New this year, any 6 year-old that requests to play-up to the 7 year-old division must attend the play-up evaluation session at Grand Slam on February 23rd at 9:00 AM. For 6 year-olds to be eligible to play up to 7, they must be able to demonstrate that they have retained the necessary skills learned in our 5-6 program and the maturity to jump from the 5-6 to the 7-year-old baseball program. 6 year-old players that register after the evaluation, or those not able to attend the evaluation, must remain in the 5-6 program.

NEW UNIFORMS: We will continue the traditions where in-house players from 9-10 through 13-14 will get to keep a new "replica" uniform shirt modeled after the uniforms of the Major League teams. The 7-8 age group players receive a Forest Hill T-shirt and a minor-league replica hat. Players in the 5-6 age groups will continue to wear and keep the traditional Forest Hill T-shirts and hats.

13-14 BASEBALL: The 13-14 Age Group will once again compete in the North Harford County Baseball League. This will be our fourth year playing in this league and, based on last year's results, will be a success once again. Players of all talent levels are encouraged to register. For 2008, this age group may expand to 13-15. Keep a sharp eye on the baseball website in early January for important news about this division.



15-19 BASEBALL: The 15-19 baseball program will field two teams again this season. These teams will play in the North Harford County Baseball League on Tuesday and Thursday evenings from mid-May through early July. Tryouts for the teams will be scheduled in mid-March. PLAYER EVALUATIONS and DRAFTS -- Players new to the FHRC baseball program, players without the previous year's evaluation, or players requesting to be moved up or down from their proper age group must be evaluated to ensure placement in the proper age group. Any player requesting to move up or down must be evaluated. No Exceptions!! Details about playing in a different age group are available on the baseball web page. All players will be placed in their designated age group as of March 8, 2008. In-house teams are selected in mid-March and players will be contacted by their managers before practice begins on March 31st.

This is a great fundraising opportunity for our travel baseball program and a great way to showcase our beautiful complex. Good food, great baseball and memorable experiences highlight these tournaments every year.

The Forest Hill Express travel baseball teams will begin their seasons in late March and will play approximately 14 regular season games and participate in four or five tournaments through late June. There is a separate financial commitment and a requirement for fundraising for all players who are on the 11-12 Travel team to help offset the tremendous expense of the Cooperstown trip. BASEBALL SPRING TRAINING CAMP -- Is your child ready for the 2008 season? They may be playing another sport now, or eating too many holiday goodies. Either way, it's time to get those baseball muscles moving. A key to having a successful 2008 season is being prepared. Spring Training 2008 is what the doctor ordered. Spring Training Camp is a benefit fundraiser for our 15-19 program and is designed for boys and girls ages 5-12 years, teaching good sportsmanship, throwing, fielding ground balls and fly balls, sliding, hitting and base running. Come hit off our wiffle ball machines, slide on our sliding mats and learn how to field like a pro. All this and more in a fun recreation league atmosphere. Three sessions are held in the spacious Churchville Recreation Center on three Saturday evenings in March. All players receive a Camp T-shirt and a Certificate of Achievement. We have a limit of only 50 participants in this Camp, so please register early. Absolute deadline for Camp registration is February 18th. See the "BASEBALL SPRING TRAINING CAMP REGISTRATION FORM" in this newsletter.

FALL BASEBALL -- If you are interested in being a Fall Ball manager or coach, complete a "Manager/Coach Application Form" and contact Chris Benjes, 410-893-6456.

Forest Hill will be placing several teams into two different Fall baseball leagues in 2008. There will be several Forest Hill teams in the 9-10, 11-12 and 13-15 age groups that participate in the North Harford Fall Baseball League (NHFBL). This is a rec-league program designed for players of all talent levels. No tryouts are necessary. The season runs from late August into November and all games are played on Sundays at the Complex and other Harford County baseball locations. In preparation for next year, age groups in the North Harford League are based on what age group the child will play in 2009.

Early Registration for Forest Hill Fall Baseball in NHFBL runs from May 1-31. There will be a \$20 late fee assessed for all registrations after May 31. The absolute registration deadline for the NHFBL is June 29th, after which the league will be closed. We will not accept any registration forms after this date so we can draft the teams and order their uniforms. Register early to save money and insure your child's spot in the league.

We will also have tryouts for fall teams that will participate in the Baltimore County Major League (BCML) program. This is a high-level league similar to our spring travel program that involves away games in Baltimore County. Tryouts for these teams will be in early July. All BCML regular-season games are played on Sundays from mid-August through October. There is also a mid-season tournament in October with games on Saturday and Sunday. Because this is a more competitive league, age groups for teams in our Baltimore County Major League program are based on the age that the child played in spring 2008. Fees will be determined as the season approaches.

Since the registration deadline for the Harford league is June 29th, players wishing to play fall baseball that are also planning to try out for a BCML team should make sure they first sign up for the NHFBL program by the deadline, and then attend the BCML tryouts. Doing so guarantees that the player will definitely play some form of fall baseball in the event that he doesn't make a BCML team. Since players can not play in both leagues, fees paid for the Harford league will be transferred to the Baltimore County program for players that make a BCML team.


