FHRC ANNUAL COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIP

The Forest Hill Recreation Council (FHRC) began its college scholarship program with the 1994 – 95 academic year. Over the past 14 years, FHRC has awarded \$46,000 to 31 recipients.

Corporate sponsors over the past 14 years include: Oak Contracting Corporation, Redland Genstar Inc., and The Building Congress & Exchange of Metropolitan Baltimore.

In September, the Scholarship Selection Committee advertises the scholarship availability for the upcoming academic year. Up to five (5) one-thousand dollar (\$1000) scholarships will be available for the 2009 – 2010 academic year. To apply, applicants must have participated in the Forest Hill Recreation Council (any program/s) for a minimum of four (4) years (in a non-paying capacity), be a high school graduate (as of September 2009), be attending college as a full-time student (as of September 2009) and include with the application a detailed list of the Forest Hill Recreation Council activities/programs participated in, as well as three letters of recommendation related to the FHRC College Scholarship and an essay explaining "Why I should receive the FHRC College Scholarship".
